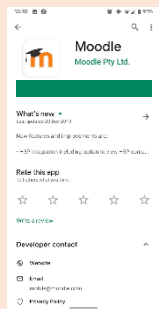


Accessing Moodle on your phone or tablet



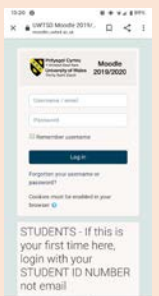
Use the Moodle shortcut on the **UWTSD Hwb app**

Microsoft Teams

Using Teams for online sessions

Your tutor may hold online teaching sessions and tutorials using a platform like **Microsoft Teams**.

Your tutor will share a **meeting link** which looks like this:

Simply click on the link when it's time for the meeting, check your webcam and microphone are working, and then click **"Join Now"** to enter the room.

Using Teams for sharing resources

Your tutor may be using **the full Microsoft Teams experience** to enable your class to communicate with each other, share resources and hold class meetings.

You can access your Team in three ways:

Visit **teams.microsoft.com** and sign in with your University login details.

At **teams.microsoft.com** you will see a download link for a desktop app at the bottom left of the screen.

Download the **Teams** mobile app



Watching lectures using Panopto

It's likely that you'll be asked to watch video lectures as part of your online learning.

Most tutors will be using software called **Panopto**.

Your tutor will provide you with the links you need.

You may be asked to sign in, always use your UWTSD Moodle sign-in
